- Case management services connecting affected families with critical resources
- Extended facility hours and expanded programming across our network
- AmeriCorps volunteers stationed at every operational Y center providing direct support



For those who lost their home or place of residence* in the wildfires, the LAY is providing immediate, comprehensive support including:

- Well-Being Coordinators will be available at each center to help navigate and coordinate care, track progress and plan long-term recovery
- The household will receive free membership and full no-cost access to all LA Y facilities and programs (such as robotics, dance, sports and more) for the remainder of 2025
- Free childcare: Before & Afterschool, PLAY, Preschool
- Children will receive priority placement in youth programs
- · Free summer day camp
- · Free sleepaway summer camp
- Free mental health services, distribution services, support networks, wraparound services and referral support

For those significantly impacted by the wildfires* the LAY is providing support including:

- Subsidized membership for individuals or families to LAY facilities and programs
- Case management access to coordinate resources and plan recovery
- · Access to free mental health services
- Access to free virtual learning and homework support for children and teens
- Expanded infant and toddler childcare and support at the Burbank YMCA
- Expanded Early Learning Readiness programming availability
- Free mental health services, distribution services, support networks, wraparound services and referral support
